## PGCERT IN EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF NOTTINGHAM, UNITED KINGDOM

Vice Principal, Ms Smita Chaturvedi and Mr. Ashish Arora enrolled for a Post Graduate Certificate in Educational Leadership and Management from the University of Nottingham, United Kingdom. The programme which was in the format of distant education was in two modules with a face-to-face interaction for both the modules.

The programme was well thought of and equally well delivered by the facilitators. The face-to-face sessions were engrossing and helped participants draw meaningful interpretations. The



discussion forums were especially enjoyed, as they revolved around the real time application of the knowledge we gained while attending the sessions. ## GERMAN WORKSHOP

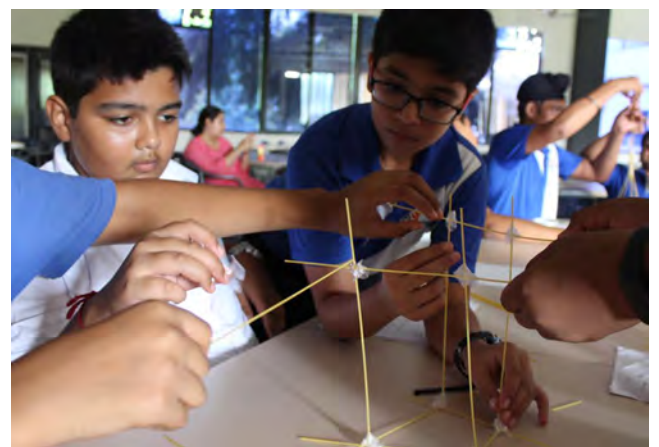
## POCSO WORKSHOP

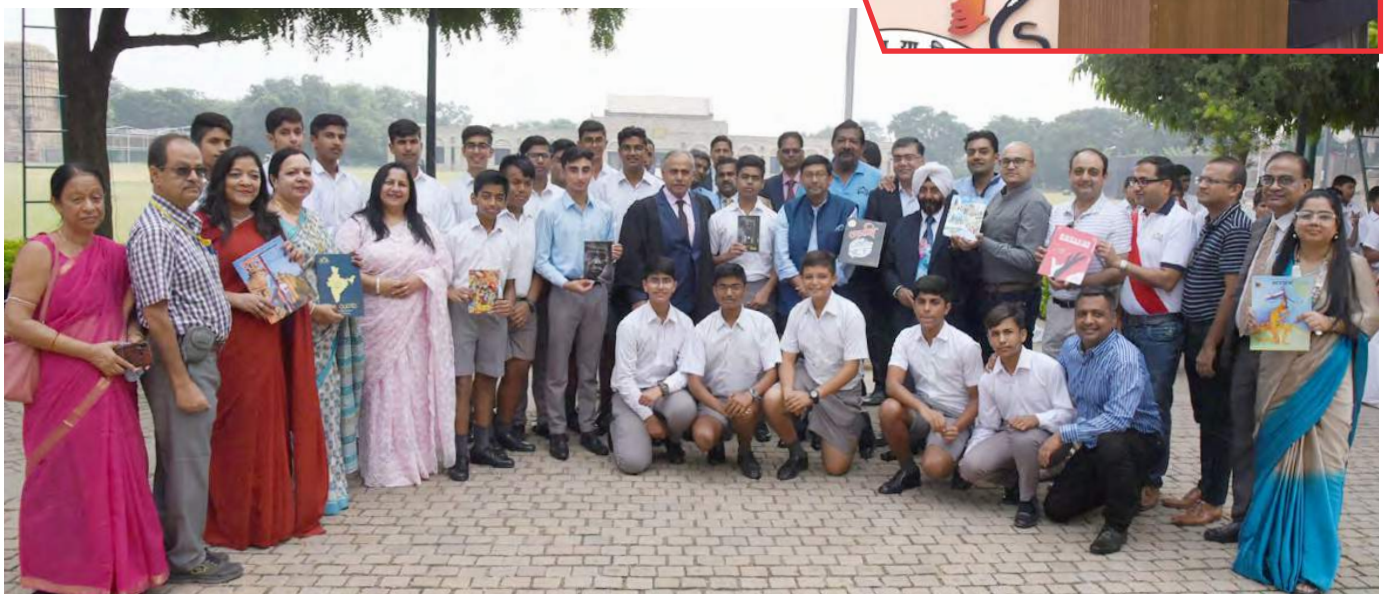

In charge - Mr. Alope Kumar Ghosh

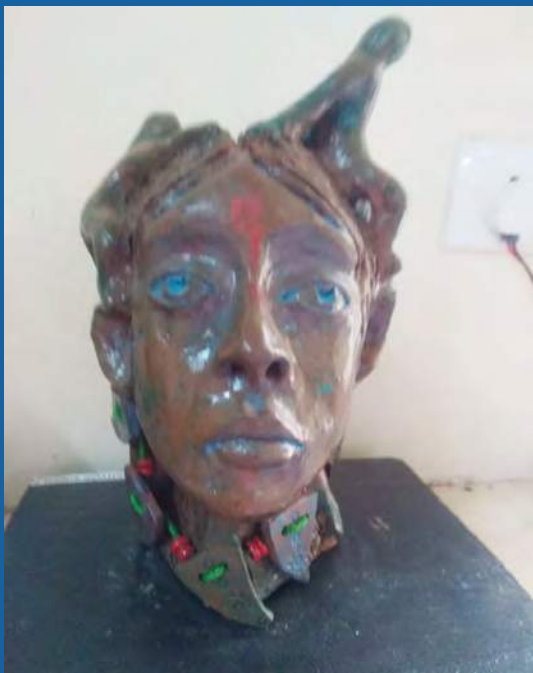

# BHABHA SCIENTIFIC SOCIETY

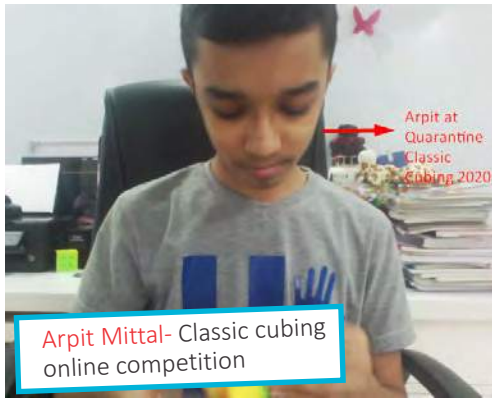

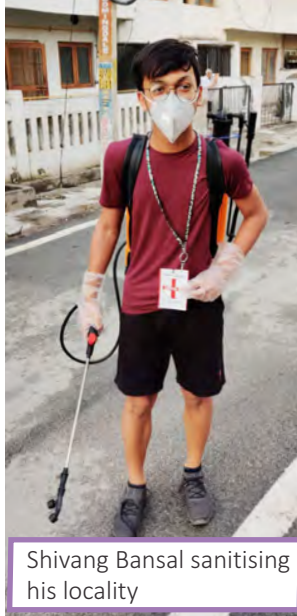
